


Normal liver

- Increase risk of NAFLD by 2-5 folds
- Increase risk of HCV infection by 3.5 folds



Chronic liver disease

- Faster progression of fibrosis in ALD, NAFLD, and chronic HCV
- Increase risks of cirrhosisin chronic HBV, and chronic HCV
- Increase overall and liver-related mortality in NAFLD by 3 folds and 22 folds



End-stage liver disease

- Decrease overall survival by 40% in 5 yr
- Increase risks of ascites, renal dysfunction, bacterial infections, and hepatic encephalopathy
- Increase risks of HCC and HCC-related mortality



Liver transplantation

- Increase post-transplant mortality, postoperative complications, and acute rejection
- Increase risks of posttransplant metabolic syndrome and newonset NAFLD after transplantation
